

EARLY LEARNING

If your child is **3 on or before September 1**, they are eligible to be enrolled in Early Learning.

Funding may be available for children who are learning English as a second language or identified with a developmental delay.

KINDERGARTEN

If your child is **5 on or before December 31**, it is time to register for Kindergarten!

Registration forms are available online at horizon.ab.ca or at your neighbourhood school. Bring your child's Birth Certificate or Canadian Citizenship status card and Alberta Health Care card.

Dear Parent/Guardian

This letter is to inform you of upcoming presentations your child in Grades 4 and or 5 will be participating as part of the Resiliency Postcard Campaign. So what is Resiliency and furthermore, why does a Campaign need to be formed on this issue? The answer is simple; research has been done throughout the world looking at the concept of resiliency and found that children, youth, adults and communities that are resilient have the ability to bounce back from life's tough times. At some point in all our lives, we have faced adversity, experienced feeling overwhelmed and believed that something was impossible, but knowing that there is someone out there, can make the biggest difference in facing the problem. One of the protective factors that help all young people is having an adult in their life that is supportive. This Campaign profiles individuals in our community that have made a difference for young people.

The Resiliency Campaign is once again using the Postcard Project to help recognize individuals that have made a difference in a young person's life. The aim is to also promote awareness of resiliency and the vital role that adults play in ensuring resilience in youth. Your child will be asked to complete the following statement on a postcard:

"An adult who made a difference in my life is...."

We feel it is important to let the adults in our community know that they are making a difference in the life of a young person. You will be requested to provide consent at a later date to allow your child's postcard to be sent to their mentor.
