- Increased opportunity for student voice through leadership, assembly participation, and cross-grade cooperative opportunities
- Dramatic improvement in grade level results from 2021 fall to 2022 spring gov't achievement and Fountas & Pinnell reading assessments; ongoing targeted supports for kindergarten – grade 2 & literacy interventions
- Increased participation and diversity evidenced in school council membership
- Implementation and piloting of new curriculum provides opportunity and challenge for teachers, resulting in adaptations and improvements to rich learning environments for students
- Increased cross-school connections through sports events, fine arts opportunities, and professional learning experiences for staff
- Refined Central School vision and mission, addressing the unique context of our families
- Circle of Courage philosophy guides our school culture in ensuring we aim for a sense of belonging, mastery, independence, and generosity
- New school song, "We are the Brave' contributes to unifying our vision and purpose at Central School
- Team meetings allow for ongoing collaboration to target priority needs of students as well as engage in sustained professional learning

- Engage our LGM liaison as a bridge for parent/ school connection and LGM parents in school events
- WOW wall incentive welcomes community support, recognition and engagement
- Music appreciation week welcomes talent and connection from community

COMMENTARY ON OUR RESULTS

- Very low participation in assurance survey, as well as school survey, creates a necessity for increased and genuine parent feedback and voice
- Address language barrier for many families to engage in meaningful feedback; need to increase opportunities for LGM and ESL families to engage in surveys and feedback
- Continued focus on literacy interventions is a priority; early learning intervention blocks embedded into school timetable; grade level professional learning; strategic resource purchases to guide impactful growth in literacy
- Sustained focus on engaging students as active members of their own learning journey is a priority; refinement of leadership opportunities, reflective practice for increased classroom engagement of students in their own learning, student recognition and empowerment program established (WOW Wall)
